Purpose: In accordance with federal regulations (34CFR 668.41(b)(c)), Luther Rice College and Seminary is providing the following information with regards to Reporting and Disclosure Information.

3. Financial Aid Exit Counseling

- If a federal loan recipient drops below half-time or completely withdraws, the recipient must fill out an exit counseling form, even if the loan recipient plans to return to Luther Rice in the future. The exit counseling form is a reminder to the loan applicant of his financial obligations. 5. Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention

- Luther Rice requires that its campus, faculty, staff, and students be drug free. The institution, including all departments and affiliated institutions within it, expressly prohibits the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance on the campus and premises. Violation of this policy will result in the immediate dismissal from Luther Rice of any student involved in these activities. In addition, faculty, staff, or students involved in such illegal activities are subject to legal prosecution under federal, state, and local law. Any student using alcohol or participating in the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of drugs while on the properties owned or used by Luther Rice will be immediately dismissed. Luther Rice also considers tobacco to be habit-forming and addictive and strictly prohibits smoking (including electronic cigarettes) or the usage of other tobacco substances while on any of the campuses or while attending other institution related activities.

- Feeling rundown, hopeless, depressed, or even suicidal
- Sounding selfish and not caring about others
- Getting in trouble with the law

- The chart below illustrates the period of ineligibility for financial aid funds, depending on whether the conviction was for sale or possession and whether the student had previous offenses. A conviction for sale of drugs includes convictions for conspiring to sell drugs.

8. Job Placement and Post-Graduate Study

- Based upon surveys of 2017 graduates, 65% of the respondents stated that they have a job that is somehow related to their degree.
- Based upon an alumni survey of those students who received their Bachelor of Arts degrees from Luther Rice in 2006, 2011, and 2015, 66% of the respondents attended an institution of higher learning after earning their undergraduate degree from Luther Rice. The majority of those respondents who listed the institution attended a school of a religious nature.
